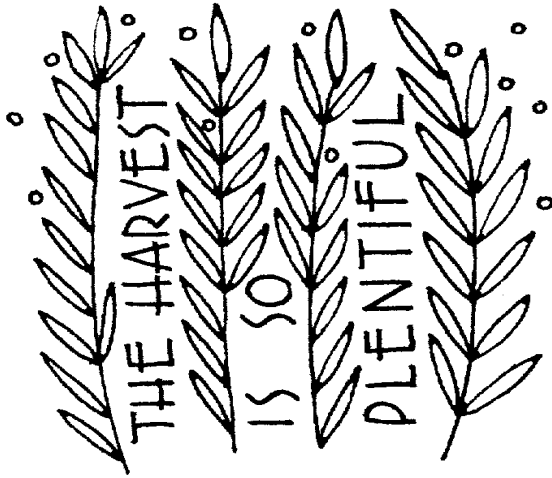

Heifer Project

An example of Heifer's beekeeping development is in the Ukraine where unemployment has become a major problem. The climate is conducive to the production of honey. Forty families will be provided with 800 bee packages as well as beehives. Beekeepers will sell the honey, making honey a production of a means of addressing the area's unemployment. The children have already donated enough money for 9 bee packages!
